When playing at Regional Finals and Finals you will no longer need to bring a current handicap certificate with you! The NAPGC are now using CLUBV1 for all our competitions which means we can access the Central Handicapping Database to find up to date handicaps. We will still require contact details from you but we will only ask once instead of at each competition.
