SENIOR MEN'S CHAMPIONSHIPS OF ENGLAND

2021 Competition Rules and Conditions

These Rules and Conditions are additional to the Rules on for Association Competitions

Format

1. The competition is open to senior male amateur golfers. It comprises a singles stableford event and simultaneously, an aggregate pairs stableford event. Play will be stableford over 18 holes from the medal tees.

Entry and Draw

2. Clubs may enter as many players and/or teams as they wish. Alternatively, players who are members of affiliated clubs may enter directly.
3. Duly completed entry forms and fees to be returned as directed before the set closing date. In addition to the entry fee those entering will be responsible for the payment of their green fees.
4. Two players entering from the same club may form a team and enter the team event by paying the appropriate team entry fee

Conditions of Play

5. For the purpose of this competition the term senior refers to men who have reached the age of 55+ on or before the day of play.
6. The maximum permitted handicap index is 28.0. A player may play with a higher handicap index but shall be limited to a handicap index of 28.0 After slope adjustment players are entitled to ninety- five per cent (95%) of their course handicap. If a player with a higher handicap index plays their actual handicap index must be shown in brackets, e.g. 28 (30)

Trophies and Prizes

7. At the national final trophies and prizes shall be awarded in the following order of preference (a player may not win more than one individual prize and trophy).
 - a. The player with the best gross stableford points shall be awarded the Seniors gross trophy..
 - b. The player with the most nett stableford points will be awarded the Riley Seniors Cup.
 - c. The player aged 70 or over on the date of play, with most nett stableford points will be awarded the Dave Saveall Shield.
 - d. The remaining best nett score shall also be awarded the runners up prize.
8. In addition, the team with the highest aggregate stableford points will be awarded the Burdett Team Trophy and team members will receive a memento.
9. The player with the best gross score will represent the NAPGC in the EG English County Champion of Champions event.
10. Other prizes at the national final will be awarded in relation to the number of entries received and at the discretion of the Competition Organiser.
